(taking of bodily substances for DNA analysis)
(Sections 487.051 and 487.052 C.C.)

To: The Peace Officers of the Province of Nova Scotia

- The offence is a primary designated offence(s) under section 487.04 of the *Criminal Code*.

The Court authorizes you to take, or cause to be taken by a person acting under your direction, the number of samples of bodily substances from the offender / young person reasonably required for forensic DNA analysis, provided that the person taking the samples is able by virtue of training or experience to take the samples by means of the investigative procedures described in subsection 487.06(1) of the *Criminal Code*.
